Marine Corps University Bachelor Enlisted Quarters

The Marine Corps University (formerly the Staff Non-Commissioned Officers Academy) is an academic instruction facility that includes a 390-seat auditorium with modern teaching equipment, instructional classrooms, administrative offices, and related support spaces. The two-story facility is 30,250 square feet in total area. Adjacent to the academy is a 1,800-square-foot armory, providing weapons storage. A 4,400-square-foot general purpose warehouse facility provides bulk and shelf rack/storage, issue counter, offices, and toilet facilities.

The Bachelors' Enlisted Quarter project is a multi-story, split-face load-bearing masonry building of approximately 45,730 square feet in total area. The three-floor facility provides 100 sleeping/living units and related support spaces for NCOs attending the adjacent academy. The complex also houses mechanical, laundry, and electrical rooms.

A single-story activity center is located adjacent to athletic and recreational center, which features covered pavilions, BBQ/picnic areas, and volleyball and basketball courts. The BEQ is linked to the SNCO Academy by a ceremonial parade deck and open-air amphitheatre.
